



Q. How can I enable saving attachments in Microsoft Outlook Express 6?

A. By default and as a security precaution to avoid saving a virus to your computer, Outlook Express doesn't let you save files locally. To enable file saving within Outlook Express, perform the following steps: Start Outlook Express; from the Tools menu, select Options; select the Security tab; clear the iDo not allow attachments to be saved or opened that could potentially be a virus check box, then click OK.

Q. How can I configure Microsoft Outlook to automatically deny read receipts?

A. Email senders can request read receipts that notify them when you read their messages. By default, Outlook will prompt you before it sends a read receipt. To permanently set Outlook to never or always send a read receipt, perform the following steps: In Outlook, select Tools, Options; on the General tab, click E-mail Options; in the E-mail Options dialog box's iMessage handling section, click Tracking Options; the options for responding to read receipts are at the bottom of the Tracking Options dialog box, which the Figure shows; select either iAlways send a response, iAsk me before sending a response, i or (my personal favorite) iNever send a response. i Click OK to close all dialog boxes.

Q. What is the Mydoom virus?

A. Mydoom is a new email virus that spoofs the sender so that the message appears to have come from a friend or respected source. The email message can carry any of several subjects, including ihi, ihello, iHELLO, ierror, iMail Delivery System, iMail Transaction Failed, iServer Report, iistatus, itest, iTest, i and iServer Request. i The body of the message contains various phrases, including iThe message cannot be represented in 7-bit ASCII encoding and has been sent as a binary attachment, iThe message contains Unicode characters and has been sent as a binary attachment, i and iMail transaction failed. Partial message is available. i The message always contains an attachment (e.g., a .zip, .exe, or .bat file). If the recipient opens the attachment, the virus creates some registry keys to ensure that it autostarts at reboot, then harvests email addresses so that it can mail itself to other people. The virus includes a Denial of Service (DoS) attack on Microsoft and SCO that is scheduled to run on set dates. In addition, the virus opens port 3127 on the local machine to let the virus writers access and control infected machines. To avoid the spread of this virus, download up-to-date virus definition files and, as always, never open an unsolicited email attachment.

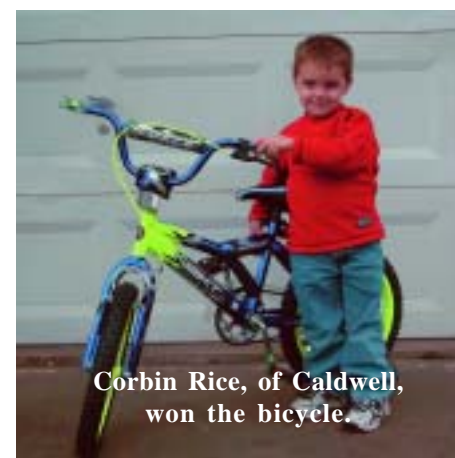

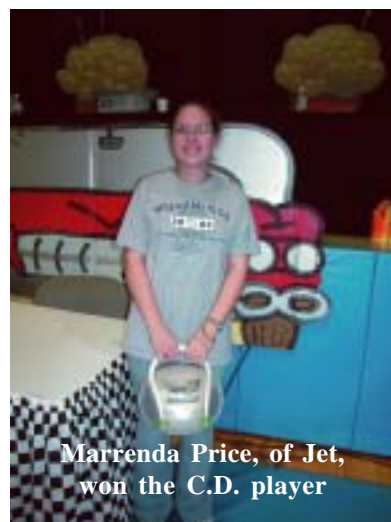

Wrapping Up 2004!

Hi again, I will give you a little run down of what we have been doing in KanOkla Country. As you probably have heard, we had the biggest KanOkla Annual meeting we have ever had. Yur Place again did an outstanding job of feeding all of us. We have two new KanOkla board members. Harold LeValley was voted in for the new representative from Braman and Kim Miller was voted in for the Caldwell/Renfrow area. J.C. Feist was re-elected as Director at Large.

I will give you a little run down of the construction project. As you know we have had an abundance of rain. The project of 2004 is about to get completed. When completed we will have installed 21 more remotes plus plowed in over a hundred more miles of fiber optic and copper cable. This will enable us to provide more than 95% of our customers with high-speed data.

We have a plan to provide high-speed data to all of our KanOkla customers by 2006. We originally had plans in the 2005 budget to do this, hoping to have most of it completed by the end of 2005 or early 2006. At the last KanOkla board meeting, we provided the Board with the 2005 project on what we needed to do plus what it would cost, and the Board voted to start the 2005 project. This will move the project up several months, which means we will be able to provide high-speed data to all of our customers. Michels Construction will be doing the 2005 Project. If you have any questions about these projects, please give us a call or stop by and see us.

KanOkla Open House for Christmas is going to be December the 8th at 10:00 and the KanOkla Store Open House will start at 5:00. The Caldwell Chamber Lighted Parade will start at 6:30. Come and see us if you can.
