



CD-ROMs provide a convenient way to save and share your movies. With Windows Movie Maker 2 for Windows XP, you can easily save your movies for playback on a recordable or rewriteable CD (CD-R or CD-RW). A typical recordable CD holds up to 650 MB of data, so you can save movies to the same CD at different times.

Movie Maker uses a wizard to guide you through the process. The wizard keeps you informed of the progress your computer is making as Movie Maker copies movies to a recordable CD. The amount of time it takes to save and copy a movie to CD-ROM depends on the size of the movie, the quality setting you choose, and the speed of your computer and recordable CD drive.

There are two ways to copy a movie to CD-ROM: The first is as follows: On the File menu, click Save Movie File, and then click Recordable CD. Option number two is: In the Movie Tasks pane, under Finish Movie, click Save to CD. In the Enter a file name for your saved movie box, type a name for your movie. In the Enter a name for the CD box, type a name for the CD.

On the Movie Setting page, do one of the following: To use the default movie setting, click Best quality for recordable CD (recommended). The specific setting details, such as the file type, bit rate, display size, aspect ratio, and frames per second displayed in the video, are shown in the Setting details area. Keep in mind that a CD typically has 650 MB of storage space, so you can adjust settings accordingly to maximize quality of the final product.

To use a different movie setting, click Show more choices, and then choose another movie setting from the list. To save the movie to another recordable CD, select the Save this movie to another recordable CD. Replace the recordable CD with another, and then repeat steps 2 through 4.

If the CD is not ejected automatically from the recordable CD drive, press the eject button on the recordable CD drive.

Town Meetings Successful

By the time you read this, KanOkla will have completed the 2004 Town Meetings. Besides showcasing what the different departments do at KanOkla, your board president, Dave Lowe, made a presentation on the new bylaws amendment options to be presented at the 2004 Annual Meeting in November. After hearing the presentation, and members' questions were answered, an overwhelming majority liked what they heard. If you weren't able to make it to a town meeting, here is basically what was presented:

1. Allow voting by mail with the following process:
 - a. No changes to nomination process before the Annual Meeting, and still take nominations from floor at the meeting.
 - b. Unfinished and New Business would still be presented at the Annual Meeting. (minutes, reports, bylaws proposals, etc.)
 - c. **After** the Annual Meeting concludes, mail ballots to **every** member, eliminating the need for proxies. (Ballots mailed to separate agent, and election results announced by mail.)
 - d. This would make voting more democratic, allowing **every** member to be heard, and would eliminate vote counting at the Annual Meeting! (Many other telephone coops have been successfully voting by mail for several years.)
2. Strengthen director qualifications by adding these four:
 - a. Must reside within district for at least 2 years prior to nomination, and must be principal residence for 9 months out of each year as director.
 - b. Cannot be an employee or close relative of a director or employee. (Spouse, child, parent, grandchild, grandparent, sister, brother, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, or first cousin.)
 - c. Cannot be employed by a competing business, even another telephone cooperative.
 - d. Each year, each director must attend at least 11 board meetings, one continuing education meeting, and one strategic planning session.

The board is not proposing any other changes this year, and a copy of the proposed bylaws will be mailed to every member prior to the Annual Meeting. The members' interests have always been kept the number one priority by your board, as is the case in these proposals. If these changes are approved by the membership, the board and I feel you will be better represented. If you have any questions, please contact me, or your district's board member. We'd be glad to hear your comments or suggestions.

Cooperative: *an enterprise or organization owned by and operated for the benefit of those using its services*

In my six year tenure as an employee of KanOkla, I am continually amazed at the desire and commitment of KanOkla's Board to offer services at affordable prices, where under a lesser commitment, those services would not be available. I guess it goes back to KanOkla's mission, "To improve the lives of our members and KanOkla communities," and to the definition of what a cooperative is.

As I travel around the country, I have visited many cities and towns, both urban and rural, whose communication providers do not provide the services KanOkla does at a rate even close to KanOkla's, and often, do not provide the service at all. A recent example is the board's desire to lower DSL costs to its members. Prices for KanOkla's DSL 320k plan are as low as \$39.95 month for residences and businesses, a reduction of up to \$60 a month. Some plans, such as our 960k plan, have been reduced by \$70 a month. KanOkla is committed to its members and committed to economic development in the areas it serves. With these reduced prices, coupled with increased demand, a larger subscriber base should develop, increasing the economies of scale. We believe this will offset the reduction in revenue, enabling us to continue to provide state-of-the-art services to our members at an outstanding value.

Another great example of KanOkla's commitment is the reduction of KanOkla's Long Distance rates. Through innovative negotiations with other business partners, we are now able to offer our members simple, flat rate prices for any domestic calls. KanOkla offers prices as low as eight cents a minute, without all those hidden fees that other providers seem to tack on.
