



In response to your feedback, this month I'd like to cover the difference between Windows XP Home Edition and Windows XP Professional.

The most basic explanation of the two operating system differences is that Windows XP Professional is a business and power-user oriented version of Home Edition. And as such, Home Edition doesn't include features that wouldn't be appropriate or would be too complex for the typical home user. The most obvious area is in security, which is greatly simplified in Home Edition. One example of such is the local users setup in Home Edition, each user set up on the system has full access and control; Professional is comparable to Windows 2000 in that it has the ability to set up limited users that are unable to tinker with system setup and program installations.

Even simpler, would be to explain the differences by describing features available in XP Professional that aren't present in XP Home Edition:

- Σ Remote Desktop - Only XP Pro supports the new Remote Desktop host feature, which is a single-session version of Terminal Services with two obvious uses: mobile professionals who need to remotely access their corporate desktop, and remote administration of clients on a network. XP Home can act as the client in a Remote Desktop session; only Pro can be the server.
- Σ Multi-processor support - Windows XP Pro supports up to two microprocessors, while Home Edition supports only one.
- Σ Internet Information Services/Personal Web Server - Home Edition does not include the IIS Web server 5.1 software found in Pro.
- Σ Domain membership - Home Edition cannot be used to logon to an Active Directory domain. For obvious reasons, the Domain Wizard is also missing in Home Edition.
- Σ Networking Features - The following networking features are not included in Home Edition: user interface for IPSecurity (IPSec), SNMP, Simple TCP/IP services, SAP Agent, Client Service for NetWare, Network Monitor, Multiple Roaming feature.

Also worth mentioning is that Home Edition will support upgrades from Windows 98, 98 SE, and Millennium Edition (ME), but not from Windows 95, NT 4.0 Workstation, or Windows 2000 Professional. You can upgrade from Windows 98, 98 SE, Millennium Edition (ME), Windows NT 4.0 Workstation, or Windows 2000 Professional to Windows XP Professional.

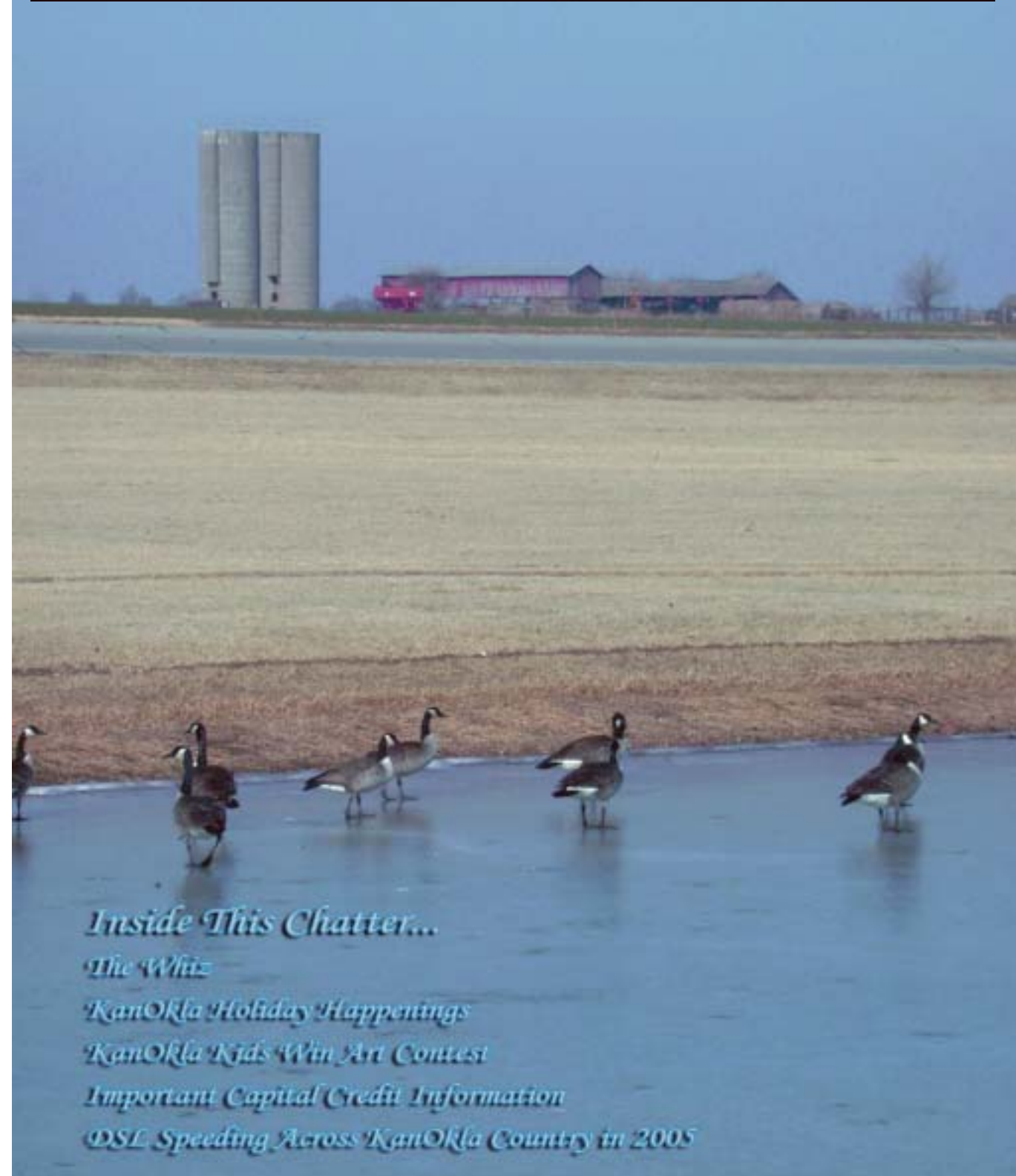

IMPORTANT CAPITAL CREDIT INFORMATION

Capital Credit allocations for the fiscal year 2004 were completed on December 8, 2004. The allocation notices were mailed to the members. These are for your records. They cannot be applied to your bill. The method of retirement of the capital credits are found in Article 7 of the Associationis bylaws, which are in your KanOkla phone book on page 9 & 10 of the red-edge pages.

If this is your first year to receive a capital credit allocation notice, you might be wondering what it is. Allocation is the act of setting apart or earmarking a portion of the profits of the Association for you the member/owner. The notice you receive contains the dollar amount that is deposited into your capital credit account for the noted fiscal year. This is your share of the margin (profit) of the Association. KanOklais fiscal year is July 1st thru June 30th. So these capital credits are for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004. We are now working in the fiscal year 2005 and have been since July 1, 2004.
